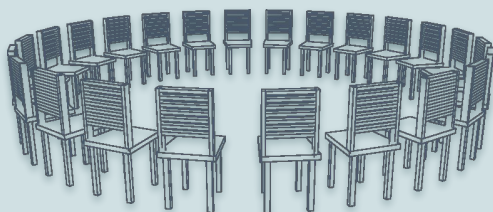
Our Vision
